Dear brothers and sisters

I was fortunate to be in Düsseldorf for the International Youth Convention. The motto of "Here I Am" was certainly evident, with approximately 30,000 people being part of the weekend. To be able to spend three days together in such numbers and in the atmosphere that this brings is something you need to be present for to comprehend. As this event was in Germany and the vast majority of participants, organisers and helpers were European, it had a European flavour however I commend the effort made by the hosting district to make it internationally inclusive. Our Chief Apostle mentioned that through their preparation and participation, the youth put life into the motto "Here I Am". I encourage not only our youth but all of us to present ourselves to God through living our faith and participating in our congregation. By opening our heart to God we will experience that He is "Here For Us".

With the celebration of Pentecost we were reminded of the power of the Holy Spirit. The powerful presence of the Holy Spirit is evident in the Church of Christ, the Apostle ministry, our congregations and our hearts. As of Pentecost 2019, the new concept of ministry was implemented. This has been introduced through various platforms including the presentation from our Chief Apostle which is still available on nac.today. You may be wondering what changes or differences we will see in our congregations? The answer is not much really. We still have the Deacon ministry, Priest ministry and Apostle ministry. In the Priest and Apostle ministries there are different functions and responsibilities.

What we may see from time to time is that Priest X conducts the divine service even though Evangelist X or a District Rector is present. All of these ministers have the authority of the Priest ministry. We will continue to address all ministers, both active and retired as they are currently known. Any future appointments will be addressed accordingly.

District Apostle visits New Zealand

Since his appointment in September, the District Apostle has travelled to many different congregations. In the following pages, we bring you some highlights of his visits to New Zealand in recent months.

In December 2018 members of the Auckland and Waikato regions gathered together for the first service conducted by the District Apostle in New Zealand. On this day the District Apostle shared a bible verse out of Acts 24, part of verses 14 - 16 with the congregation: *"I worship the God of my fathers, believing all things which are written in the Law and in the Prophets. I have hope in God, which they themselves also accept, that there will be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust. This being so, I myself always strive to have a conscience without offense toward God and men."*

The District Apostle impressed on the congregation what a joy it was to be in the house of the Lord. He encouraged all to take the words of the opening hymn into their hearts – we love the place where God's honour dwells. We love this place and the presence of the Lord. We can be ourselves and we are loved, as we are.

The nature of our Saviour must grow within us; all mankind lives under the blessing of our Heavenly Father. The District Apostle asked the congregation – why are we here? What was our personal story? Let us look at our own life and story.

The District Apostle admonished the congregation not to lose hope. What makes hope powerful? When we believe that something is attainable. What makes our goal attainable? The fact that Christ made this possible, He made it real. He has done it already and He wants to share it with us.

Apostle Williams and Evangelist Scott were called to serve. In his final serving before retirement Evangelist Scott encouraged the congregation to live according to the will of God and pass it from generation to generation.

The divine service was followed by fellowship and a musical presentation from all areas of the work; choir, orchestra, soloists, Sunday school, youth and even district leaders and rectors presented items. It was a special and blessed event, enjoyed by all.



District Apostle visits New Zealand

In February the South Auckland congregation welcomed District Apostle Schulte and Apostle Williams into their congregation.

For this divine service the District Apostle chose a word out of Joshua 15:19: *"She answered, 'Give me a blessing; since you have given me land in the South, give me also springs of water.' So, he gave her the upper springs and the lower springs."*

In his serving, the District Apostle referred to the bible story in which Caleb's daughter asked for a blessing after being given the South land. The South land was a desert. She asked for springs of water as a blessing. Caleb gave her the upper springs and the lower springs. Her father gave her more than she asked for. Our Father also blesses us with more than we ask for. To have water in the desert is a blessing of abundance. In the spiritual context, receiving blessings from the upper springs relates to our soul and blessings of the lower springs relate to our body. Without blessings we are barren like a desert where no growth can take place without water.

The District Apostle dispensed Ruby wedding blessings to Evangelist and Sister Adams and Priest and Sister Smith. After service the congregation enjoyed fellowship together. It was an event that would remain with the brethren for a long time.



The following weekend, District Apostle Schulte and Apostle Williams travelled to Wellington. This was the District Apostle's first visit to the city.

The visit commenced on Saturday with a divine service for ministers and wives. A total of 16 ministers and wives attended this service.

On Sunday the congregation came together for the service of intercession for the departed. The District Apostle used a word from the Chief Apostle - Psalm 145:18-19: *"The Lord is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth. He will fulfil the desire of those who fear Him; He also will hear their cry and save them."*

Priests Nagel and Schubach were called to stand as proxy for the celebration of Baptism, Holy Sealing and Holy Communion for the departed. After service the congregation enjoyed the opportunity to have fellowship and spend time getting to know the District Apostle.

District Apostle visits Papua New Guinea



On Saturday 30 March District Apostle Schulte, accompanied by Apostle Pouru, travelled to Popondetta, in the Oro Province of Papua New Guinea. From there, they took a hired vehicle and went all the way to a congregation in the Kokoda district called Sisireta, where more than 1000 members had gathered to attend a divine service.

On Sunday the Apostles drove to another congregation called Kararatta on the coast of the Oro province. Here, another thousand members attended the divine service.

During the next few days the District Apostle conducted divine services in a number of congregations in the Madang province, before flying to Port Moresby to conduct meetings with Apostle Pouru and Apostle Wasimbai.

On Saturday the Rainbow congregation organised an outing with the confirmands. They had discussions about their faith and asked the District Apostle and the Apostles many questions. After that they went sightseeing before heading back to the camp for lunch.

On Sunday the District Apostle conducted the divine service in the Rainbow church where 260 members were in attendance. During this service the confirmation blessing was bestowed on twelve young people, including the daughter of the late Apostle Hungito.

At the conclusion of the service the congregation celebrated together with the confirmands over lunch. The 60th birthday of Apostle Pouru was also celebrated with a surprise birthday cake presented by the Rainbow youth, confirmands, Sunday School and the Apostle's children.



Sunday School Big Day Out

On Sunday 2nd December the Sunday School children of the Auckland and Waikato districts of New Zealand came together for their final Sunday School Service and Big Day Out event for 2018.

The service was officiated by District Elder Graf and the theme for the divine service was "It's more blessed to give than to receive". During the divine service the District Elder engaged five children to show the different attitudes when giving. To further support the theme the children donated tinned foods to the Auckland City Mission and presents to the Christmas Shoe Box Appeal.

Following the divine service, the children enjoyed an afternoon filled with plenty of games in the sun and, to the delight of our young ones, a visit from Santa!

Youth Convention - New South Wales

The 2019 youth convention was a great opportunity that enabled the youth to spend quality time together and grow closer through our relationship with God. Through activities such as playing card games, the obstacle course activity and telling stories, our bond and friendships grew.

On Saturday night we were able to discuss a range of topics with Apostle Williams. Exploring the cultures that we share in our youth group allowed us to understand and appreciate each other's experiences. Additionally, we discussed the tragic act of inhumanity experienced in New Zealand two weeks earlier which cost the lives of 51 people. The cruel reality of this world, whereby individuals take extreme measures to fulfil their radical ideas, has been felt very close to home and has left us shaken and in disbelief. This left us pondering: "How can we reconcile with evil?"

The youth and Apostle Williams reached the conclusion

that we as Christians should lead by example, and not punish by repaying evil with evil. We should not tolerate anti-social behaviour and should promote and contribute towards the establishment of a peaceful and harmonious society by respecting each other for who we are, irrespective of our differences. We ought to respect and accept others, even when we do not necessarily agree with their beliefs.

We CAN forgive those who do evil but acknowledge that everyone should be responsible for their actions and this also applies to perpetrators of profound immoral events. We ought to be a blessing without condemning and practice what we preach by loving our neighbour.

On behalf of the youth, we would like to thank those who organised the weekend, especially Priest Andre and Sister Alana who gave up their time to look after us and made this convention one to remember.



