From the desk of District Apostle Schulte



Dear brothers and sisters

Yesterday, today and tomorrow.....

In a recent divine service our Chief Apostle mentioned that "we are sometimes tempted to compare the present to the past and conclude that it was much better before. Such an approach is not likely to comfort us. We would be better to follow Apostle Paul's example and view the present in light of the future."

Apostle Paul encouraged the Corinthians not to focus on looking back at the glory of the old covenant (which was glorious in its time), but rather live with the glory that is revealed today through the Holy Spirit and look to future glory with Christ.

We can never discard yesterday. We are thankful for the visionaries of yesterday and those who worked with them. Much of what we have today was established by them. Much of what we know today was learnt through the experiences of yesterday. The means and knowledge provided by our previous generations are the "tools" we work with today. We want to continue to recognise the value and the gift of the past.

We often look back and reflect on the "good old days"; in reality we are not looking back at the "good old days" as a whole, rather we are only reminiscing about the good days of the old days. There were many things that, as in today's world, weren't perfect.

In our church life, our predecessors - although not perfect were guided by the glory of the Holy Spirit. Those who, through their teaching and example, taught us to pray, to offer, and follow Christ. They taught us of the gift of salvation, the gospel message, and the promise of Christ's return to take us with Him to a place He is preparing for us.

I read an interesting article of an Australian pioneering family. The writer mentioned that the development of the land had been commenced by their predecessors (yesterday), then during her lifetime a lot of development, therefore progress, had happened (today). In concluding her story, she summarised by saying that progress and development wouldn't stop in her time but would continue into the generations to come (tomorrow).

Today, we live with and work with the glory of the Holy Spirit. The Apostolate works confidently with the promise of Christ that He would be with them until the end of the age. In His high priestly prayer the Lord Jesus prayed for the believers of the future. We live today still under the effects of this prayer. As Christians our hope lies with the gospel of Christ and His promises. Let us allow ourselves to go confidently into the future, being led by the Holy Spirit through the Apostolate.

Let us, with clear vision, embrace the glory of the Lord and be transformed into His image from glory to glory (2 Corinthians 3:18).

District Apostle in Redcliffe, Qld

On Sunday, 23 August 2020, District Apostle Peter Schulte conducted the divine service for the congregation of Redcliffe. On that occasion he was accompanied by Apostle Trevor Williams, District Elder Uwe Hoffmann and District Evangelist John Thorne.

In the current situation where we have to impose our COVID Safe plan, our church buildings have limited capacity for members able to gather. Hence, it was the case that all members of the congregation could not be present to experience the festivities of the day. The congregation's string ensemble created an environment for contemplation and meditation as preparation for the commencement of the divine service.

The accompanist played hymn 28, "We love the place, O God", as the opening hymn for the divine service. District Apostle Schulte's sermon was based the Bible word that we read in Luke 7: 33–35, "For John the Baptist came neither eating bread nor drinking wine, and you say, 'He has a demon.' The Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look, a glutton and a winebibber, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' But wisdom is justified by all her children."

The District Apostle's message was that with understanding for the teaching of Christ we embrace the gospel and apply it to all the circumstances of our lives. The District Apostle explained, the people at that time of Christ criticised John the Baptist because he abstained from certain foods and, they criticised Jesus for what he ate and drank. This can be explained with the colloquialism; "Damned if you do, and damned if you don't". In summary the District Apostle stressed that we can have a life with all its responsibilities and faith as well. We do not have to give up one to have the other. That will just be an excuse for either not living your faith or being an irresponsible individual.

On this occasion, acts that were to take place during March earlier this year were carried out. The rector of the congregation, Evangelist Graham MacKrill – who had been an active minister for 44 years – was placed into well-deserved retirement. During his time of active ministry, Evangelist MacKrill served the children of God with kindness, patience and understanding. He had also made a considerable contribution to the development of the music work in the congregations throughout the Australia.

Priest Shaun MacKrill was appointed as the new rector for the Redcliffe congregation. Deacon Scott Andrews was ordained into the Priest ministry and Brother Siva Chetty was ordained into the Deacon ministry.

Another significant event on this day was the blessing bestowed on Priest Brett and Sister Natalie Schulte, who received blessings on the occasion of their silver wedding anniversary.







Day of celebrations in Morayfield, Qld

On Sunday, 27 September 2020, District Apostle Peter Schulte conducted the divine service in the Morayfield congregation. For this special event, which had been postponed earlier in the year due to coronavirus restrictions, he was accompanied by Apostle Trevor Williams, District Elder Uwe Hoffmann and District Evangelist John Thorne.

The church was filled to its COVID-19 seating capacity. The divine service was also streamed to family members and friends who were unable to be present in the church to witness the retirement of the rector, Evangelist Graham Wolff, and the appointment of the new rector, Priest Kent Andersen. During the service, retired Priest Graham Herbert and his wife, Sister Sandra Herbert, received blessings on the occasion of their Golden Wedding anniversary.

District Apostle Schulte's sermon was based on the bible word that we read in Hebrews 3:14, "*For we have become partakers of Christ if we hold the beginning of our confidence steadfast to the end.*"

In the beginning of his sermon, the District Apostle reinforced the value of our relationship with Jesus Christ. Like the early Christians, our relationship is manifest in the four-fold worship that we want to steadfastly practice; the apostle's doctrine, fellowship, the breaking of bread and prayer. The District Apostle reinforced that though we pray for the best outcomes for our family's and our own earthly circumstances, this is not the measure of our blessing or our relationship with Christ. Our devotion to salvation; eternal life with Christ, is our greatest blessing that we have confidence in.







Church dedication in Papua New Guinea

On Sunday 23 August, Apostle Allen Pouru conducted a church dedication service in Siririm, in the Morobe province of Papua New Guinea. On this occasion, he was joined by Apostle Patrick Silabe. Over 1600 members and guests were in attendance for the service. Apostle Pouru used a text from 2 Chronicles 6:20-21 "...that Your eyes may be open toward this temple day and night, toward the place where You said You would put Your name that You may hear the prayer which Your servant makes toward this place. And may You hear the supplications of Your servant and of Your people Israel, when they pray toward this place. Hear from heaven Your dwelling place, and when You hear, forgive".

There was much happiness in the hearts of the brethren as they gathered to mark the dedication of the church, built to the honour of God. The message was given to remember that the mercy shown by Jesus Christ is felt time and again whenever God's children gather to worship. The plea was for everyone to come and worship in truth and in spirit. As the bridal souls, we look forward to the day when Christ returns to redeem us, and we can then experience His fellowship at the marriage of the Lamb.









Divine service for senior members

With members in Victoria still in lockdown, and many senior members still not attending divine services in person due to higher risks during the pandemic, a special divine service was planned for the senior members, which took place on Sunday 18 October.

Arrangements were made for the seniors to gather in a Covid-safe environment in our churches in person (where possible), and others joined online. One or more active priestly ministers were present in the congregations to serve Holy Communion.

In a coordinated arrangement, six transmission points were engaged during the service:

- District Apostle Schulte conducted the service from Mackay, Queensland;
- Apostle Williams assisted from North Ipswich, Queensland;
- Apostle Lodewick served from his home in Melbourne, Victoria;
- Musical items were presented throughout the service from Beverly Hills (NSW), New Lynn (NZ), North Ipswich (Qld), and Kingston, (Qld);
- The transmission team in Kingston hosted the service over Zoom and YouTube

The service was conducted under the theme "I will never cease to love You, Lord", which was also the opening hymn. District Apostle Schulte used a bible word from Psalm 71:14 *But I will hope continually, And will praise You yet more and more.* The service reflected on the faithfulness and willingness of the seniors past and present to sacrifice. The work of God in our district is where it is because of this.

After all seniors present in churches received Holy Communion, the District Apostle celebrated the sacrament of Holy Communion for the departed in Mackay. The service concluded with the benediction and a musical item.

271 senior members were in attendance in person, and there were 126 online connections.

Apostle Williams visits Silkstone, Qld

Apostle Trevor Williams held the divine service in Silkstone congregation on Sunday, 30 August 2020. On this occasion, the Apostle was accompanied by District Elder Uwe Hoffmann and District Evangelist Richard Graf.

The church and the congregation were prepared as their rector, Priest Trevor Bruiners, was to go into his well-earned retirement during that divine service.

The accompanist played hymn 135, "Let us turn our faces to the light", as the opening hymn. Apostle Williams' conducted the sermon based on the Bible word that we read in Ezekiel 1:28; "Like the appearance of a rainbow in a cloud on a rainy day, so was the appearance of the brightness all around it. This was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the Lord."

The Apostle's message was that our Heavenly Father remains with His children in the most difficult of circumstances. The prophet Ezekiel questioned why the glory of God was in Babylon and not in Jerusalem in the temple. He received the comforting explanation that God was with His people, even in the most difficult circumstances and situations.

On this occasion, acts that were to be carried out earlier this year took place. As stated, the rector, Priest Trevor Bruiners, who had been an active minister for 26 years, was placed into retirement. During his time of active ministry, Priest Buiners was an outstanding example for all in pastoral care. He served all brethren with love and understanding, bringing many sacrifices unselfishly. Priest Basil Scott was appointed as the new rector for the Silkstone congregation.











Support for Solomon Islands

COVID-19 DONATIONS

At the end of March this year, the Solomon Islands government declared a State of Emergency in response to the COVID -19 pandemic. Due to the limited health resources in the country, it was felt that the only way to keep the population safe was to ensure that the virus did not enter the Solomon Islands.

Restrictions imposed centred around the closure of borders, limiting of the movement of vessels and aircraft and temporarily closing public spaces.

Schools and educational institutions were shut down for 8 weeks, and informal markets – a source of food and income for many members of the community – were banned from operating in the capital of Honiara. As a result, many people living in the city returned to their villages.

The State of Emergency has now been extended until November. The self-sustaining culture that exists in the villages means that those people who have returned from the city can be provided for by their families. However, many people who remain in the cities are now struggling, and with little government assistance available to them many face an uncertain time. The New Apostolic Church was pleased to offer support by donating food items such as canned fish, rice, noodles, tea and sugar, which were distributed to those who found themselves needing assistance during this time.

REPAIRS TO BUILDINGS

Due to cyclones and aged buildings, termite infested timber and simple wear and tear, long outstanding repairs were recently undertaken in a number of areas. Local labourers were used, including members who have building experience. In some instances material for the repairs was donated by others, for which we are very thankful. In the White River church, all labour and material for the internal repairs of the building was donated.

















Apostle service for Samoan members

Due to Covid-19, the borders of many countries have closed, meaning that international travel is not possible at this time. As a result, it has become the "new normal" to conduct divine services and meetings using online tools and platforms. In some cases, this has involved some modifications to service times, to take into account time differences.

On Sunday, 20th September, Apostle Lodewick conducted an online service from Melbourne, Australia for the congregation in Vailima in Samoa. Twelve months earlier, the congregation came under the word of the Chief Apostle when he visited Samoa. Since that time, it has not been possible for the congregation to have an Apostle service, and so this was a very blessed opportunity for all who could be connected.
