From the desk of District Apostle Schulte



Dear brothers and sisters

The value of our local congregation is unquestionable. Everything we need for salvation is offered there. In our local congregation, the word of God is preached, the sacraments are dispensed, forgiveness of sins is given and the 'coming together' of the bridal congregation is developed.

The occasions when we are able to come together in a combined service are special opportunities that are also very beneficial for our spiritual development. We are able to receive a great boost in our joy of faith, our courage to profess and the spiritual energy needed to serve, thank, and hope in our future with Christ.

The visit of our Chief Apostle to Sydney (Australia), Kombikum and Madang (Papua New Guinea) is an example of one of these special occasions. Vital to our experiencing this is our personal preparation. This includes longing to be part of these divine services, joyful expectation and spiritual connection through prayer. Whether we physically attend one of these divine services or connect through audio visual transmission, let us personally elevate the importance of such occasions.

The belief in and the necessity of the active Apostle ministry with its divine authority for the developing and completion of the bridal congregation, defines our New Apostolic faith within the Church of Christ.

I would like to include a few points from our Catechism that describes our Chief Apostle's role:

It is the task of the Chief Apostle to discharge the office of Peter. In the presence of the other Apostles, the Lord granted Simon Peter special authority. His leading position among the apostles took effect after the Lord's ascension into heaven but was certainly already suggested prior to this event.

Our Chief Apostle carries this out in accordance with the words of Jesus: "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it. And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:18-19).

The Chief Apostle works to keep the oneness among the apostles, has a function to keep the doctrine pure while developing it further, opening up new insights and uniformly spreading the testimony of faith. The Chief Apostle also lays down the order within the church.

These tasks comprise the "authority of the keys" of the Chief Apostle ministry.

Peter Schulte

Departed service in Sydney, NSW

When NSW and the ACT had their last combined service in 2019, no one could have predicted that it would be close to three years until such an opportunity would come again.

The timing could not have been better as NSW had just relaxed Covid restrictions sufficiently for a divine service that included both the full range of instruments for the orchestra and powerful singing from the choristers.

For the first time, a very suitable hall in Liverpool was used and physical attendance exceeded expectations. Together with District Apostle Peter Schulte and Apostle Trevor Williams, everyone present enjoyed the first divine service for the departed in 2022. The Bible text for the divine service was from John 10, verse 16: "And other sheep I have which are not of this fold; them also I must bring, and they will hear My voice; and there will be one flock and one shepherd."

District Apostle Schulte highlighted that the way to be saved is the same for everyone; there is only one way to attain eternal life. He stressed that the flock is an image for the Church of Christ. Jesus Himself is the one who saves. The highpoint of the divine service was the celebration of Holy Communion which was followed by the congregation witnessing the dispensation of Holy Baptism with water, Holy Sealing, and Holy Communion to the departed.





NACare: Latest news

The website of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies defines disasters as "serious disruptions to the functioning of a community that exceed its capacity to cope using its own resources. Disasters can be caused by natural, man-made and technological hazards, as well as various factors that influence the exposure and vulnerability of a community." It stands to reason that irrespective of the cause of a disaster, the very inability of an affected community to successfully respond to and remediate the situation invokes a requirement for help from sources that have the capacity to assist.

NACare was established to be a channel through which anyone who wishes to donate funds to assist communities in need where the donor can be assured of the donation being applied as intended. Anyone can donate and donors and would-be donors can attest to their friends and acquaintances that their donation will be respected and applied according to the intention with which it was given.

Currently NACare has two Disaster Appeals open as well as supporting one longer term project:

Tonga Disaster Appeal

This appeal was launched on 5 April 2022 and is focussed on assisting communities in Tonga with the essentials of daily life following the volcanic eruption which occurred on 15 January 2022. In the aftermath of this event the governments of the first responder countries provided rapid relief by supplying goods to the communities. This phase of the relief effort was very timely and successful but obviously wound down as the immediate needs

were attended to. However, this event completely destroyed the gardens which forms the basis of Tongan society and economy so that they are not able to sell their produce at market in order to earn money to purchase essential items. These gardens have been replanted and the resultant crops are now growing. Until then, the need for assistance remains.

2022 QLD and NSW Flood Appeal

The devastating results of these widespread and significant floods continue to be well reported on. Any monetary assistance that can be provided to the affected communities will aid their wellbeing and help to reduce the immense suffering. All donations received by NACare will be passed on in full.

Solomon Islands Early Childhood Centre Project

This project assists young children in the community to engage in education that will prepare them for the future. Education in Solomon Islands is not readily available and this project seeks to give more children opportunity that would otherwise not be possible. The Covid-19 pandemic has had its effect upon this project over the past year with a pause having to be inserted in the program but this requirement has now effectively passed and the project activity can be continued to the delight of all the children.


Rest assured: 'Whatever happens, it is always Jesus who wins in the end!" And He will grant the victory to those who fight against evil together.


