

# From the desk of District Apostle Schulte



Dear Brothers and Sisters

In 1 John 3:1 we can read 'Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God'. Do we take the time to appreciate the fact that we are children of God? Our human understanding cannot comprehend the characteristics and nature of God. If we apply the gift of faith that God has given us, we are able to begin to see him as perfection and absoluteness.

Are we constantly aware of and do we value the environment of the closeness of God that we have? Already in the creation story it is evident that mankind can be tempted into thinking that 'the grass is greener on the other side of the fence'. To want to improve our circumstances of life is normal; our focus as children of God however is that we do it in a manner that is in line with His will, and do not diminish our connection to Christ.

There are situations in a family environment where the parents' character or behaviour is questionable. In contrast, when children see a great example and are given guidance and loving support, their growth and development is strengthened. The love and nature of God has been revealed to us through Jesus Christ's life and teaching, and spiritually He wants to give us guidance and loving support.

Jesus loves each and every human being unconditionally. He loves us whether we are strong or weak. He neither judges

or condemns us. He is always prepared to forgive us and is eager to save us. He listens to us, understands us, and helps us. He allows us to benefit from the merit that He alone was able to acquire – at the cost of His life. Everything He does is perfect. He allows us to obtain the same perfection as He has attained without requiring us to be perfect. He invites us to follow Him and encourages us to become like Him. He has promised that He would be our source of strength and comfort.

At the time of the early Apostles, the authorities didn't want the people to know about the great works and the teaching of Christ. They commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Jesus. Peter and John's response was 'Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you more than to God, you judge. For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard".

Dear Brothers and Sisters, as children of God let us be filled with courage to profess more and more, our joy and happiness in the privilege of being a child of God.

This provides them with the ability to be self-sustaining within their families and communities.

### Connecting with QUEENSLAND

Earlier this year, the congregation of North Ipswich merged with Silkstone, to form the Ipswich congregation. Following the last service in the North Ipswich church, the members enjoyed fellowship and had an opportunity to take a walk down memory lane.









District Apostle Schulte conducted a combined service for the Q1-Q5 subdistrict congregations on Easter Sunday. During this service, District Elder Uwe Hoffmann was placed into retirement, after serving in ministry for over 41 years. District Evangelist Richard Graf was appointed as district rector for Q1-Q5, and Priest Craig Scott assigned as assistant district rector for Q1-Q2. Additionally, Priest Avron Dennis, Priest Scott Andrews, and Priest Tino Pena were assigned as assistant rectors for Windsor, Redcliffe, and Ashmore congregations respectively. ### Update on NACARE

The NACare Early Childhood Development programme commenced in 2021 in the Honiara region of the Solomon Islands. The three focus points are children, parents and caregivers, and local government.



- 1. Children aged 4 7 years old are at the heart of our programme. We want to promote a quality **Foundation** and holistic programme that can assist in creating an enabling environment for children to achieve
- the best possible outcomes in life. It was intended that children would be 'school ready' at the end of their preparatory programme.
- 2. In consultation with our local representatives, we identified gaps in the competence of parents to both read and write. We noted that there were high instances of malnutrition, and that school attendance and performance was impacted by a lack of school readiness programmes. One of our objectives was to strengthen the capacity of parents and primary caregivers to be involved with, care for, and stimulate their children through training and support.
- 3. Local authorities are a key contributor to the success of the programme and before we commenced with the programme design, government was consulted to try and identify any areas for collaboration. Funding of this program will ensure that successful outcomes continue into the future, and provide a positive start for many young children.









Currently, the centre is operated by NACare Pacific at the New Apostolic White River church. While attendance fluctuates due to inclement weather and political volatility, at least 35 children access the programme on a daily basis. We do not have enough teachers or space at our White River facility and unfortunately have to limit our intake to avoid crowding that would negatively impact learning.

Recently, with the support of an anonymous donor, additional ablution facilities have been built to ensure that children are safe and separated from other activities which happen around the market vicinity.

Increasing pressure on our building has seen us initiate plans to build a separate structure, adjacent to the current building, which can be divided into 2 sections. This will see us increase our capacity to accommodate additional children into the programme.

An unintended but positive consequence of our programme in White River has seen the establishment of a similar programme in the village of Boneghe. These courses are taught at our church building by qualified teachers. The school currently provides education for 37 children who are drawn from five communities in and around the school. ### Visit of Chief Apostle Schneider

The Chief Apostle and District Apostles previously visited Perth in 2016, when the International District Apostles' meeting took place in the city. Although the visiting group is much smaller this time, the anticipation and preparation taking place is no less sincere.

The group will attend the Moveathon event on Saturday, which is an opportunity for all those who are in Perth to enjoy some fellowship together, while engaging in some physical activity. The focus of the afternoon is to raise awareness of, and funds for, the Early Childhood Development programme in the Solomon Islands, which is run by our charity arm, NACare.

A divine service will take place on Sunday in the South Perth Community Hall, which will be streamed via YouTube to all nominated congregations. Details regarding the events, locations and times can be found both in your congregations and on the Facebook page: Chief Apostle Visit - Perth 2023.

An Apostles' meeting will take place during the time in Perth, before the Chief Apostle and his party travel to Adelaide - known as the city of churches. Here, he will conduct a divine service in the Hackham West church on Tuesday evening.

At this point in the trip, it becomes necessary to discard the jackets required for the cold winter weather in Australia, and prepare for the humid summer temperatures of the northern hemisphere.



#### WHAT IS NACARE?

NACare was established in 2015 as the charity arm of the New Apostolic Church (Western Pacific district). NACare works to improve and strengthen communities in the Western Pacific region by funding local projects such as skills and education programs.

#### SOLOMON ISLANDS EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Over many years of visits to the Solomon Islands, a need was identified in the early childhood sector, and in 2021 an Early Childhood Development programme was established in White River. Increasing demand has seen us initiate plans to build a new structure adjacent to the current structure which will allow for greater capacity to accommodate additional children into the programme.

Achieving our fundraising goal of \$10,000 will assist in the academic development of the children, provide assistance to the building renovations required to ensure the children have an appropriate learning facility and also provide teachers with the necessary resources and training to deliver education programmes.
