Report from Apostle Patrick Silabe

The region of Papua New Guinea that is overseen by Apostle Patrick Silabe recently endured torrential rainfall, which resulted in washed-away roads and bridges, as well as numerous landslides. Tragically, a local rector and his wife were caught in one such landslide while tending their garden. Despite rescue efforts, only the rector's wife could be saved.

In the wake of this disaster, funds were donated to provide muchneeded aid. The Apostle and his team organised relief efforts, distributing non-perishable food supplies. Villagers, including youth, contended with washed-out paths and relentless rain to transport these provisions back to their communities. Alongside the relief efforts, divine services were conducted in each village, offering spiritual comfort and strength.

Following the initial relief mission, Apostle Silabe embarked on a gruelling journey to a remote, mountainous area last visited in 2014 via helicopter - a mode of transport now inaccessible due to financial and logistical constraints.

With unwavering determination, the Apostle and his team

travelled as far as possible by PMV vehicle before undertaking a three-day trek through treacherous terrain. Members from nearby villages also walked long distances to gather at central points for divine services.

During this mission, the Apostle conducted significant spiritual work. He sealed 393 souls at one location and 556 at another, in addition to performing 30 ordinations. The combined attendance across both locations reached 1,274. These gatherings were filled with spiritual joy and celebration, despite the immense physical challenges faced by all.

The return journey proved equally arduous, involving another three-day trek through the jungle. The team rested in makeshift shelters along the way, before finally reaching a point where they could access transport back home.

This account stands as a testament to the resilience, faith, and unwavering commitment of Apostle Patrick Silabe and his community. Together, they worked tirelessly to uplift one another - both spiritually and physically - amidst adversity.













Visit of Chief Apostle Schneider - PNG

In June 2024, Chief Apostle Jean-Luc Schneider visited Papua New Guinea, accompanied by District Apostle Edy Isnugroho from Indonesia. He was joined by District Apostle Peter Schulte, retired District Apostle Andrew Andersen, Apostle Trevor Williams, and Apostle Des Lodewick from Australia. Their visit brought immense joy and inspiration to the members in Papua New Guinea.

The Chief Apostle's first-ever planned visit to the island of Kimbe had to be cancelled due to a flight disruption. However, District Apostle Schulte and Apostle Trevor Williams, accompanied by Apostles Allen Pouru and Patrick Silabe, were still able to travel to Kimbe. They were warmly welcomed by the Sunday School children and conducted a divine service with the local members.

Meanwhile, the Chief Apostle continued with his scheduled activities, including a meeting on Saturday afternoon with all Apostles. This gathering strengthened the unity and collaboration among church leaders.

On Sunday 9 June, the Chief Apostle conducted a divine service at the Sir John Guise Indoor Sports Complex Hall in Port Moresby. Approximately 1,400 members from across the country gathered to participate in this special occasion. The youth and Sunday School children greeted the Chief Apostle with a spirited performance of singing and a marching band, creating an atmosphere of celebration and togetherness.

During the service, Apostle Allen Pouru was placed into retirement after 37 years of faithful service in the Apostle ministry. District Elder Kenneth Korokai was ordained as an Apostle, ensuring continued care for the spiritual needs of the congregations.

For the first time, the service was transmitted live to all congregations in Australia and New Zealand, connecting members across three countries in a shared experience of faith. This historic visit highlighted the strength and resilience of the members in Papua New Guinea, affirming the bond of unity within the global New Apostolic Church.

The Sadau congregation, established in 1982, has reached a significant milestone with the dedication of their new church. This achievement stands as a testament to the unwavering commitment and sacrifice of the congregation members. Over the past eight years, they worked tirelessly to complete the chapel, beginning construction in 2016. Materials for the chapel were carried by hand over a challenging three-hour trek to the village.

The dedication service was conducted by Apostle Patrick Silabe and attended by 1,678 members and 565 guests, including government leaders and church representatives. Leaders from Bulolo, Lae, Markham, and Madang were present, alongside district rectors from Madang and Morobe. Retired Apostle Allan Pouru also joined the celebration, further adding to the joy of the occasion.



















Connecting with **NEW ZEALAND**

In recent months, the Christchurch and Timaru members came together for a ministers and spouses service conducted by District Apostle Schulte. On another occasion, he also travelled to Whangarei, where he conducted a divine service for the local congregation.

Members of the Christchurch congregation enjoyed a sunny family fun day with a BBQ and plenty of fellowship. In Drury, District Evangelist Shaun van Wyngaard held a Sunday School service, which was followed by fun activities for the children. On a separate occasion, the Sunday School children in Honiara enjoyed a fun-filled games day, bringing much excitement and laughter to the young participants.





















Connecting with KOREA

District Apostle Schulte and Apostle Wolf visited South Korea, where they held various activities with the local members.

On Saturday, District Apostle Schulte met with ministers and their wives, offering valuable teachings and insights. He particularly focused on the topic of 'most Holy Faith' shared by the Chief Apostle during Pentecost. After a brief break, he spent over four hours answering many questions from the ministers and their spouses, addressing as many concerns as time allowed.

On Sunday, District Apostle Schulte led a divine service for around 200 members, both in person and online. During the service, two priests were placed into retirement. Afterward, members enjoyed a joyful lunch fellowship, reconnecting and sharing the blessings of the visit.









Connecting with MARSHALL ISLANDS

Apostle Des Lodewick travelled to the Marshall Islands to spend time with the members. The journey from Australia can be quite challenging, with limited flight options and long travel times, often making the travel itself longer than the visit. Despite these challenges, the joy and fellowship shared during these visits make the effort well worth it for all involved.



Update on NACARE

The NACare Foundation Early Childhood Development Centre in Honiara, Solomon Islands, has continued to grow from strength to strength since its inception in 2021. Initially focused on providing early childhood education for children in the White River region of Honiara, the programme has expanded to Boneghe (Honiara), Barasipo (Western Province), and Makaruka (Weather Coast), with the generous support from our partners and friends. These contributions have strengthened the curriculum, provided learning resources, and enabled the construction of additional classrooms and facilities.

The programme, which began with children aged 5 to 7 in Honiara, is now open to all children, regardless of background or belief, and is not intended as a proselytising tool. In September 2024, the project visit aimed to monitor and strengthen the White River facility, formalise the programme's expansion across the Solomon Islands, open new classrooms to introduce Year 1, and build a playground for early learning. Attendance has increased to around 85%, with a small fee helping ensure regular participation. The Year 1 syllabus has seen strong results, with 12 out of 15 children achieving an average score of over 80%, and four scoring above 90%.

The Boneghe centre has also grown, with funds allocated to resources and the development of a new classroom for 25 students. Discussions with teachers have led to improvements in daily reporting and measuring learning outcomes, which are expected to improve in the coming academic year.

During Apostle Lodewick's September visit to the Western Province, he discovered a self-funded initiative inspired by the

White River centre, which has since expanded to the Weather Coast. NACare is exploring ways to support this grassroots effort.

The White River centre also celebrated the opening of its newest classroom in September, with a festive event attended by parents, children, teachers, and community leaders. Apostle Lodewick thanked everyone for their contributions to the success of the school, reiterating the programme's commitment to protecting children and fostering strong communities.

For a long time it had been the ambition of the programme to provide an opportunity for volunteers from Australia to travel to the Solomon Islands and contribute in a meaningful way. This project visit saw our first volunteer, Pr Derek Clark travel with the team to build a playground for children enrolled in the programme. This involved guiding a team of willing helpers in the design and construction of a swing and cubby house.

Despite instructions that the equipment was only for the children, District Apostle Schulte took time to test the swing and ensure its safety for the children before officially opening the playground. The event was attended by the Minister for Home Affairs, Honourable Isikele Vave, and other dignitaries, and was made possible through generous donations from individuals and organisations.

Looking ahead, NACare plans to send another group of volunteers to the Solomon Islands in March 2025 to assist with building desks, blackboards, and other infrastructure. Donations are welcome, and those interested in volunteering are encouraged to get in touch.


